

### FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & CHAIRMAN

Dear Members, Supporters and Friends,

It is our pleasure to present the FY 2022/2023 Penn-Northwest Development Corporation Annual Report. The purpose of this report is to communicate to our membership and the public how Penn-Northwest performed in administering the agency's  $Program\ of\ Work\ (POW)$  for economic development initiatives in Mercer County. This report includes information about the companies that received support directly from Penn-Northwest in conjunction with our many partners that make up the  $Improvement\ Movement\ Team$ .

For the past 30 years, a declining population has challenged Mercer County through the loss of young families and some of the best and brightest talent from our communities. In response to this issue, Penn-Northwest implemented its first ever Program of Work nearly a decade ago. The Program of Work focuses on new industry recruitment, local industry development, driving local entrepreneurship, workforce recruitment and development, marketing, and membership. But the true mission is designed to have a positive lasting impact on population growth and subsequently lower Mercer County's unemployment rate by attracting young, skilled workers and families back to the area.

During FY 2022/2023 Penn-Northwest generated 28 new industry leads, distributed 21 prospect proposals, and coordinated 9 site tours which led to 4 new companies locating in Mercer County. In addition, Penn-Northwest assisted over 32 local companies with increased investment and employment by providing \$7,350,000 in direct technical, financial, workforce, and other financial support. Penn-Northwest, in conjunction with the Shenango Valley Enterprise Zone Corporation, The City of Hermitage, The Community Hope Investment Partnership, and the Greenville Area Economic Development Corporation, committed \$410,000 to launch the Mercer County Innovation Fund to encourage entrepreneurship and investment in technology and innovative manufacturing.

We were also pleased to partner with the Environmental Protection Agency to implement a \$500,000 Brownfield Assessment Grant which assisted multiple sites to become shovel-ready for New and Local Industry projects. Penn-Northwest attracted 18 new corporate and individual memberships during the fiscal year and generated a total membership revenue of \$205,020. We were also fortunate to receive \$40,000 in community foundation support.

This annual report highlights the success of our economic development efforts in bringing our community one step closer to improving the overall economic health and vitality of Mercer County. And, through greater collaboration with our regional partners, and a more focused regional approach, we will continue this strategic initiative because together, we can help convince even more people and companies that they too can **Make it** *in!* **MERCER COUNTY!** 



# **Executive Summary**

Fiscal Year 2022/2023 marked the successful completion of Penn-Northwest's eleventh *Program of Work*. In completing the goals and objectives of the FY 2022/2023 *Program of Work*, staff reported overall direct program investment for new and local industry projects in an amount exceeding \$7 million and the retention and creation of over 1,000 jobs. New industry projects that Penn-Northwest participated in during FY 2022/2023 included Advanced Power & Energy, BPI Inc, Castle Canning, and Coney Island. Penn-Northwest remained fully committed to the success of Mercer County's existing businesses and assisted more than 32 local companies through technical assistance concerning needs ranging from workforce recruitment & training, IT infrastructure, rail, and water & sewer infrastructure.

As a public/private partnership, Penn-Northwest relies heavily on the contributions from private companies. Membership funds collected in the amount of \$205,020 and private foundation support in the amount of \$40,000 helped PNDC surpass our original goal of \$180,000. The Membership Development Committee put forth initiatives to solicit 18 new members while also retaining existing members for the **Make it** *in!* Mercer County Campaign.

Under the business administration section of the *Program of Work*, staff successfully worked towards keeping expenses manageable. PNDC is actively engaging in a Recruit, Renew, Reduce initiative to ensure that in addition to recruiting new members and encouraging existing members to renew, the organization is reducing the cost of implementing programs.

Advanced Power & Energy offers Level 3 Electronic Vehicle Chargers powered by specialized Zinc 5 batteries capable of storing up to one million watts of energy. Their Level 3 chargers can take a car battery from 30% to 100% in half an hour, as opposed to Level 2 chargers, which may take as long as eight hours to charge a car. The new technology is taking root in Greenville, PA, at the old Greenville Motors site, and is supported by Penn-Northwest, the Mercer County Innovation Fund, and the Ben Franklin Technology Partnership.
